EXPLORE Acts 26:4-18

- How does Paul open his defense in this passage?
- How has Paul lived from childhood?
- Why does Paul say he is on trial?
- What is the promise the Jewish people were "hoping to see fulfilled"?
- Prior to his conversion, what was Paul opposing or fighting against? How did he carry out his opposition?
- What happened along the road to Damascus?
- What are the specific events which occurred along that road?
- What does Jesus tell Saul in the vision?
- Where does Jesus send Saul? To do what?

APPLY Acts 26:4-18

- How would you describe "the way you live" to a non-Christian interested in what the Christian way of life looks like?
- Who has known you "for a long time" and would accurately speak about your way of life?
- What is your hope? Where do you place your hope?
- In what ways are you earnestly serving God day and night?
- How incredible does it seem to you that God raises the dead?
- Prior to your new life in Christ, how did you oppose the Gospel, or oppose Christians?
- When did you first come to faith in Jesus? How were you saved? Share your testimony with someone this week.
