Celtic Hymns & Songs

IMMORTAL, INVISIBLE

This tune is a Welsh folk melody from the early 19th century. The words were composed by Walter Smith in Scotland in the mid-19th century.



LET ALL THINGS NOW LIVING

This melody is a traditional Welsh folk tune, “Ash Grove”, also known widely in Ireland. The words you’re singing, were written by Katherine Davis in 1939.



OLD 100TH

This familiar tune originates back in the 16th century in Geneva, from the Swiss Reformation Psalter; adapted by the Scottish Church for use in their singing book of Psalms, the Scottish Psalter (1650) as the music for Psalm 100.



O SING A SONG OF BETHLEHEM

Words by Louis Benson (1899), a survey of Jesus’ life and ministry. The tune, *Kingsfold*, is a traditional Irish folk tune also known as “The Star of County Down.”



BE THOU MY VISION

This music dates back to the 5th or 6th century, a tune called “Slane”, named after the hill in Ireland where the first Easter fires were lighted by St. Patrick as a challenge to King Laoghair. The lyrics date from around A.D. 700, an ancient Celtic prayer poem.

COUNCIL OF JERUSALEM, part 2

Study Questions

March 22, 2015

“Council of Jerusalem, part 2:
James Speaks”

READ Acts 15:12-21

EXPLORE Acts 15: 12-21

- Who comprised the “Whole Assembly”? What did Barnabus and Paul present to them?
- Why were the words of Barnabus and Paul spoken at this particular time and why was it significant for this moment?
- Who was James? Why could he command the assembly’s attention?
- Why do you think James refers to Paul now as Simon and why is it significant?
- In vs 14, how does James characterize God’s work among the Gentiles?
- What scriptural evidence does James put forth? What is the meaning of the text presented and why is the use of scripture important within this Assembly?
- In vs 19-20, precisely what judgment does James render? How will it impact the message to Gentiles coming to the faith and how will it affect those living the faith?
- Why is the message of verse 21 significant in James’ conclusion?

APPLY Acts 15: 12-21

- We will find ourselves in assemblies of various kinds discussing faith issues. What instruction does this passage provide for such occasions?
- Apply this text to our role in helping those who are “turning to God”? How should it speak to our presentation of the gospel?
- Apply this text to how we live out the gospel and the message to those who are newly God’s people? “How then shall we live”
- This text is about both the gospel for those seeking salvation, and the gospel as it is lived out in faith. Apply this to your own life and the life of our church? What would the application of this text look like?
