Study Questions

Jul 13 - 19, 2015

READ Acts 20: 7-12

EXPLORE Acts 20 7-12

- Vs. 7, on what day do they come together? What do you think it means they “came together”?
- Vs. 8, how late did Paul speak and why?
- Vs. 9, what happened to Eutychus and why?
- Vs. 9b, in what condition Eutychus after his fall? From the text, what evidence is there that he was actually dead?
- Vs. 10, how did Paul respond to the boy’s condition and what did Paul say?
- Vs. 11, after this event, what did Paul do? How long did Paul continue speaking?
- Vs. 12, what response did the people have as they left for home in the morning?

APPLY Acts 20: 7-12

- How does this text model the coming together of the church to worship? What do you see as the reasoning for this particular meeting and in what way does it relate to your own worship attendance?
- A boy critically or mortally injured in this passage. How can we best react to such events in our own lives or the lives of others?
- This text provides a lovely image of Paul falling upon this boy and embracing him with compassion and calmly proclaiming “He’s alive!” We may never experience such an obvious, extravagant miracle but what picture does this passage provide of God’s response to our damaged selves?
