READ John 5:1-15

EXPLORE John 5:1-15

- If you have access to a computer, research the views of the Pool at Bethesda.
- Who stayed around this pool and why?
- How long had the paralyzed man been at the pool?
- When Jesus encountered the man, what did Jesus ask of him?
- What was the man's response? Paraphrase his response in your own words.
- Describe Jesus' healing of the man and the man's response.
- How did the Jewish leaders respond?
- What do you think of their response?
- From vs. 13, we're told Jesus slipped away into the crowd. What does this tell us?
- In vs. 14, what does Jesus do and how does he mentor the man?
- What is the man's response?

APPLY John 5:1-15

- Applying this model, how can we approach those who are disabled long-term, physically, emotionally, mentally or spiritually?
- What law or laws are we encouraged to follow in this passage?
- The model of Jesus in this passage is of being incognito in his ministry. Apply this idea to our involvement in people's lives.
- How can we apply the response of the Jewish leaders to our own lives?
- Jesus follows up with the healed man to instruct him in deeper truths. What model does this provide us for our involvement with people in our lives?
