## ***RIOT IN JERUSALEM***

### **Study Questions**

Aug 10– Aug 16, 2015

**READ** Acts 21: 27 - 36

**EXPLORE** Acts 21: 27-36

- Vs. 27a, what is the significance of the “seven days”-18, who greeted them in Jerusalem and how were they received?
- Vs. 27b, which Jews saw Paul at the temple and stirred the crowd? Why is their response not unexpected?
- Vs. 28-29, what claims are made against Paul and upon what are the claims based? Are these claims well-founded?
- Vs. 30-31a, how did the Jews respond and what was their ultimate aim?
- Vs. 31b -32, who intercedes for Paul and how do they handle Paul?
- Vs. 33, compare this mob scene with that of Acts 19:32-41. What similarities or differences do you see? How is the city clerk’s response of chap. 19 similar and/or different than that of the Roman commander and what was his chief goal?

**APPLY** Acts 21: 27 - 36

- Paul’s life and teaching prepare him for moments such as these. Consider how we can best emulate Paul (and Jesus) to best prepare ourselves for such moments.
- If claims are brought against us, how can we speak and live lives that inoculate us against false claims?
- Mobs and mob mentalities never come off well in history. Consider how such mentalities arise and how we as Christians can best avoid being caught up in them
- Paul’s convictions, teachings and actions never result in a mob. Consider the people who surrounded Paul on his way to Jerusalem from this mob. How can we live to promote unity and love as opposed to the hatred and violence of this Jerusalem mob?
