The deposit is separate from the wedding fees and is retained to hold desired wedding date. Refund of deposit will be assessed following ceremony and clean up. Any damages, fine or necessary cleaning* will be deducted from the deposit. If the need to cancel should arise, the following schedule will be applied to the deposit.

Wedding Use Policies & Guidelines: Community Presbyterian

This building has been dedicated as a house of God and for His purposes. Please keep this in mind and respect the building accordingly.

1. Smoking and alcoholic beverages are not permitted on the premises.
2. Food or drinks not allowed in the Sanctuary.
3. Throwing of birdseed restricted to outside of building. Nothing else may be thrown. Bubble blowing is acceptable.
4. Use only drip less candles.
5. Rearranging building furniture, wall accessories, or any other items belonging to the church needs to be confirmed with the Church Administrator **in advance**. We cannot guarantee last minute requests.
6. The church does not offer office accessibility to use of phone, copy machine or computer. Please make other arrangements for these items.

AMENITIES AVAILABLE:

1. The sanctuary seats approximately 190 people. Another 50 chairs can added in the foyer.
2. The following list of items available to you prearranged with the Church Administrator. Please check all items desired and return, at least one month prior to your wedding date. We cannot guarantee last minute requests.
